GERTRUDE STUDER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Details

PURPOSE:

The Gertrude Studer Memorial Scholarship award program is offered by North Western Electric Cooperative, Inc. (NVEC) and awarded by the Edgerton Area Foundation in memory of Gertrude Studer. She spent her entire life in rural Edgerton in homes serviced by NVEC. Gertrude is credited with attending every annual meeting of the cooperative since its inception. She also loved attending the Williams County Fair and was involved in the local 4-H and FFA organizations throughout her life.

Following her death at the age of 109 in February 2017, the Gertrude Studer Memorial Scholarship was created to encourage and reward rural Williams County students who have been involved in the 4-H and/or FFA organizations and who have committed themselves to the pursuance of further training and education while also offering the students an opportunity to become more aware of rural cooperative careers.

AWARD:

One winner will receive a \$500 cash award. The award is non-renewable. The disbursement of the award will be administered by the Edgerton Area Foundation.

INTERVIEWS

In-person interviews will be held on **March 6, 2024 at Defiance College** and all eligible applicants are required to participate on that day in order to be considered for the scholarship award. Additional information will be mailed to the applicants prior to that date regarding specific interview times.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST - to be considered for this award, all the following MUST BE submitted by the deadline date:

- _____ **Application form (two pages)** - Information must be confined to the official form. Applications must be submitted **by 4 p.m. on Friday, February 9, 2024.**
- _____ **An official, signed grade transcript**
Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of **3.5 or above** on a 4.0 scale or an equivalent standing on a nontraditional scale.
- _____ **One essay - typed, 800 words maximum**
Guidelines for the essay are included on page 3.
- _____ **A recent photo of the applicant** - A photocopy of a photo is acceptable.

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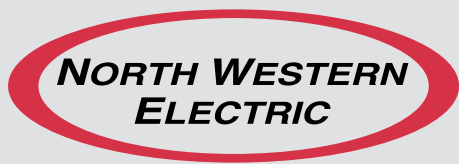
Scholarship Rules

The following provisions will govern the acceptance of applicants for the Gertrude Studer Memorial Scholarship:

1. Applicants must be the son, daughter, or legal ward of a permanent residential NWECC member-owner receiving service for the duration of the 2023-2024 academic year (August 2023 - June 2024). Children/wards of NWECC commercial member-owners are not eligible unless one of their parents/legal guardians is also a permanent residential NWECC member-owner.
2. Applicants must be graduating seniors who have all basic credits for college or proper vocational or technical school entrance. A “proper vocational or technical school” is defined as a post-secondary institution where credits can be transferred to a state accredited four-year college.
3. Applicants must be a permanent resident of Williams County and attend a high school located within Williams County.
4. Applicants must be actively involved in a local 4-H and/or FFA organization.
5. Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of **3.0 or above** on a 4.0 scale or an equivalent standing on a nontraditional scale.
6. Winners must provide proof of enrollment in an accredited college or proper vocational/technical school of students’ choice to claim their scholarship.
7. Members of the immediate families and persons residing in the households of trustees or employees of NWECC are not eligible to participate in the competition.
8. Applicants who receive “full-ride” scholarships (i.e., scholarships that cover the cost of tuition, room, board *and* books) to the schools of their choice are not eligible for scholarships from NWECC.
9. All scholarships must be accepted in the first academic year following the student’s high school graduation. However, an extension of one year may be granted for just cause in the judgment of the President/CEO of NWECC. In the event students are unable to fulfill their enrollment obligation under this program, the award is forfeited.
10. These rules supersede all previous rules for this scholarship.

All rules stated within this document conform to the policies and program guidelines as set forth by North Western Electric Cooperative, Inc.

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Essay Guidelines

The North Western Electric Cooperative Gertrude Studer Memorial Scholarship was created to honor Edgerton native Gertrude Studer who was dedicated to her family, her electric cooperative and to her local 4-H and FFA organizations.

Each applicant must submit a short essay describing how the applicant's involvement in 4-H and/or FFA has enriched their lives, has assisted in the development of their personal character and has contributed to their ability to succeed.

The suggested outline will answer the following points:

- Why did you join 4-H and/or FFA?
- What types of activities have you been involved in since you joined?
- What specific goals as a part of the organization have you achieved and how did you achieve the goals?
- Why do you think your involvement in the organization will help you to succeed at college/vocational/technical school?

The essay must be at least 800 words and must be typed, double-spaced. Please place your name and address at the top of each page.

Please return your completed essay by attaching it to the application form.

Deadline to submit is 4 p.m. on Friday, February 9, 2024.
